# **Overview of Regional Development**

- (1) Purpose of Report
- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide an overview to the Derby and Derbyshire Joint Committee for Economic Prosperity (D2JC) on a number of matters that are being progressed at regional level.
- (2) Discussion / Decision Required by the D2JC
- 2.1 The D2JC is requested to:
  - i) Note the summary presented below including the recent call for projects by the Derby and Derbyshire, Nottingham, and Nottinghamshire (D2N2) Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP)
  - ii) Consider the presentation by Midlands Engine (to be shared at the meeting) regarding the opportunities presented by the Government's Gigahub proposals and strategic corridors work.
- (3) Update: LEP Funding
- 3.1 The D2N2 LEP has launched a £6.5m grant fund to deliver a range of capital projects in the low carbon sector across D2N2. The call supports national and sub regional policy including Government's "Net Zero Strategy: Build Back Greener" and the "The Ten Point Plan for a Green Industrial Revolution". Both of which set out ambitious targets for carbon reduction and incentivising investment in both the public and private sector in to Green and carbon saving projects.

- 3.2 The D2N2 Low Carbon Growth Fund will support low carbon capital projects to create a pipeline of investable propositions that can be match funded to help the region meet challenges around high carbon dioxide output and unclean industrial practices.
- 3.3 The following criteria are confirmed:
  - Successful projects must identify new and innovative ideas and must be able to clearly demonstrate current or future carbon reduction, including carbon sequestration.
  - Grant funding will be capped at £1.5 million per project to ensure the monies can be invested in as many projects as possible.
  - Projects must demonstrate match funding of up to 50% and be able to start delivery in the 2022/23 financial year.
  - No completion deadlines have been published.
- 3.4 The following timelines are confirmed:
  - Expression of interest documentation publicised, and consultation process opened – 1<sup>st</sup> December 2021
  - Consultation for project sponsors to be closed 12<sup>th</sup> January 2022
  - Submission deadline for all bids 28<sup>th</sup> January 2022
  - Scoring process finalised 11<sup>th</sup> February 2022
  - Projects informed of outcomes 14<sup>th</sup> February 2022

### 4. Update: Midlands Connect

- 4.1 The focus of Midlands Connect is framed around six areas of activity, all of which are set within the context of levelling up:
  - Powering our net zero future
  - Investing in transport for growth
  - Extending our global reach
  - Accelerating digital connectivity
  - Evidence and intelligence
  - Pioneering in health and life sciences
- 4.2 Two key projects are being taken forward at the moment and Midlands Connect is seeking support and input from local leaders:
  - i) Project Gigabit: £5bn government infrastructure project to drive better digital connectivity. The East Midlands has been approached by BDUK to lead a regional gigabit project (the first of its kind). BDUK is specifically seeking delivery capabilities to:
  - ii) Strategic Economic Corridors specifically the A50/500 for which £540,000 been allocated from across Government departments

- (DLUHC, DfT) and Midlands Connect to focus on transport, green growth, digital and internationalisation
- 4.3 Roger Mendonca from Midlands Connect will attend the D2 Joint Committee to outline the proposals and opportunities for local authorities
