	We know that you have used one or more of the services before, so we wanted to tell you more about the Review.
2020	We started the Review in 2018. The last time we contacted you was March 2020.
corona virus covid-19	We stopped the review during the COVID 19 pandemic.
	We are now ready to start the Review of the short breaks again.
	Joined Up Care Derbyshire is the group of different organisations that work in health and social care. They will be working together to review the short breaks services.

	We want to make services fair for everyone with a learning disability and their families in Derbyshire.
ETAGRU O UPDATE	There have been some changes since we last wrote to you. These are:
	 We stopped the services at Valley View and Amberley because we did not have enough staff to work there to give you a safe service.
Care Plan	 Your health and social care needs may have changed since we started the Review.

	 We couldn't use the Robertson Road because we needed to keep people safe from COVID-19. The NHS has contacted you about plans to reopen Robertson Road.
	A worker from Derbyshire County Council or the NHS will contact you to arrange an assessment or review. This assessment or review will help to find out:

	 What you want to be able to do.
	 What care or support you may need to make this happen.
<form></form>	 We have sent you Derbyshire County Council's 'This is me' template. This can help you to get ready for your assessment/review.

	Anyone involved in your care and support in the NHS or from Derbyshire County Council will be part of your assessment or review.
Care Plan	There may be some changes to your care and support after the assessment or review.
	We will talk to you, your family, carers, or workers that know you well during your review.
	If you do not have any close family or carers, then we can ask an advocate to work with you. The advocate will help the workers to understand your needs and what you want your care and support to look like
	We are not going to make any changes to the NHS short breaks service straight away.
Assessment	We will look at all the assessments and reviews to see what people with learning disabilities and their families/carers need.

Plan	This will help us to decide what the short breaks service should look like in the future. This could mean making changes to the services that you have used before.
