Health and Wellbeing Round Up Report

1. Purpose

- 1.1 To provide the Board with a round-up of key progress in relation to Health and Wellbeing issues and projects not covered elsewhere on the agenda.

3. Round-Up

3.1 UK Covid-19 Inquiry. Module 1: the resilience and preparedness of the United Kingdom

Following the conclusion of the first investigation, the UK Covid-19 Inquiry has published its first [report](#). The Inquiry's investigations are organised into modules, and module 1 examines the state of the UK's central

structures and procedures for pandemic emergency preparedness, resilience and response.

3.2 Child Poverty Taskforce kicks off urgent work to publish strategy in the spring

Urgent work on tackling one of Britain's biggest social injustices began on 14 August 2024 as the government's Child Poverty Taskforce met for the first time. Further information can be found [here](#).

3.3 Men's health: the lives of men in our communities

The Local Government Association (LGA) have published a [report](#) exploring why men's health is a national concern. The report highlights that men in the most deprived areas in England live nearly 10 years fewer than those in the least deprived.

3.4 Moving communities impact report

Sport England has published a [report](#) that looks into leisure facilities in England and their role in their communities. The report found that more people are using leisure facilities now than this time last year. In particular it notes a growth in leisure centre usage by economically disadvantaged groups, with visits from users in the most deprived 20% of areas increasing by 9%.

3.5 National Evaluation of the Preventing and Tackling Mental Ill Health through Green Social Prescribing Project: Final Report - March 2021 to June 2023

Sheffield Hallam University have published a [report](#) that examines the effectiveness of green social prescribing in tackling and preventing mental ill health.

3.6 Household Support Fund extension

In the Spring Budget the Government [announced](#) that the Household Support Fund which was due to end on 31 March 2024, will now be extended for a further six months until 30 September 2024.

3.7 Independent Investigation of the National Health Service in England

Lord Darzi's [report](#) provides an expert understanding of the current performance of the NHS across England and the challenges facing the healthcare system. The report considers patient access to healthcare, the quality of healthcare being provided and the overall performance of the health system.

4. Notification of Pharmacy Applications

Under the requirements of the National Health Service (Pharmaceutical and Local Pharmaceutical Services) Regulations 2013 the NHS Commissioning Board must notify the HWB of all relevant applications to provide pharmaceutical services, including the relocation of existing pharmacies.

Notification of the following applications have been received:

- 4.1 Please note that PCT Healthcare T/A Peak Online Pharmacy, Manor House, Merlin Way, Quarry Hill Road, Ilkeston, Derbyshire DE7 4RA ceased to provide pharmaceutical services on 31 May 2024.
- 4.2 Please note that PCT Healthcare Limited T/a Peak Pharmacy, 6 Market Place, Staveley, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S43 3UR will cease to provide pharmaceutical services from 05 October 2024.
- 4.3 Change of supplementary hours for Peak Pharmacy, 16-18 High Street, Staveley, Derbyshire S43 3UX. The supplementary hours have changed from Monday to Friday 13:00 – 14:00, Saturday and Sunday closed to Monday to Friday 13:00 – 14:00, Saturday 09:00 – 13:00 and Sunday closed.

5. Healthwatch Intelligence

- 5.1 Healthwatch have provided a summary of recent data relating to Children and Young People. The service categories identified were CAMHS, Health Visitors – Baby, Children’s Social Care, Podiatry and Paediatric Care. The full summary can be found at appendix 2.
- 5.2 In September 2022, Healthwatch Derbyshire engaged with young people at two further education colleges to find out what young people do to help them thrive and keep physically and emotionally well.
